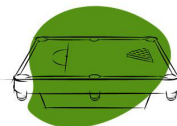

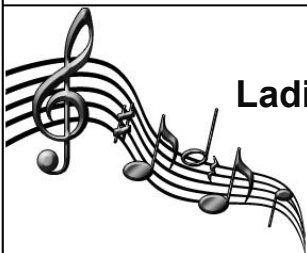

### Letter from School Place

The council recess already seems like a distant memory. I spent most of it at home, taking advantage of the good weather to tackle all those outdoor jobs left undone on account of my council duties. However, I did manage to take up an invitation to the Eday Gala, where my children enjoyed the sandcastle building competition (winning best overall) and entered their home-made go-cart in the cart race. At the Sanday Show our Muscovies won the 1st, 2nd & 3rd duck prizes, our geese took all the goose prizes (again), and my 10-year-old, 4' 5" daughter made a good effort showing a 14.2 hh mare.

At the last full council meeting before the recess I tabled my first amendment — to refer a decision on joint headships back to the Education, Leisure & Housing (ELH) Committee. And at the Marine Spatial Plan event I brought up the lack of local jurisdiction over the seas between the North Isles. (I hope we might find a way of gaining some control through a North Isles landscape partnership scheme or "Our Islands – Our Future".) Before the recess was over, I was back in the council chamber for the air and ferry services consultative committee meetings and a meeting of the Orkney & Shetland Valuation Joint Board.

A good piece of news that came out during the recess is that, after extensive lobbying, OIC has been granted additional Discretionary Payment Funding to help ameliorate the impact of the "bedroom tax" on council tenants in Orkney.

Since the "new term" started at School Place, I have attended meetings of Stronsay and Sanday parent councils, Papay and Shapinsay community councils, the Licensing Board, the Licensing Sub-Committee, and the Constitutional Reform Working Group. After the conclusion of a meeting of the Orkney College Management Council, Prof. Jane Downes gave an encouraging presentation on the development of an archaeology institute based at the college. I was less encouraged by the proposals, presented at the ELH meeting, for a "home schooling" solution for Flotta, and I voiced my concerns that this could ultimately set a precedent for cut-price education on North Ronaldsay, Papay and Eday.

The success of the Orkney team at the 2013 Island Games in Bermuda was celebrated at an evening reception in the council chamber, and it was interesting to speak to the participants about their experiences. Maybe territories like Bermuda could provide a constitutional model for Orkney.

We continue to live under the cloud of the ongoing ferry dispute. As reported in "The Orcadian", I wrote directly to the leaders of the three unions concerned detailing the disruption their dispute is causing to our lives and livelihoods and requesting the unions to call off their action during balloting. Two of the leaders replied, but neither was willing to consider it. Bob Crow never wrote back.

The Development & Infrastructure Committee (of which I am not a member) has considered the principle of OIC establishing its own onshore wind farm development. At last notice is being taken of my past proposal of an Orkney energy company!

We had a very successful "Our Islands – Our Future" conference. Speakers included academics, politicians and representatives from Faeroe and Åland (island groups which already enjoy a high degree of autonomy). It is now time to engage the public in the debate, and push for changes being initiated in advance of the independence referendum and which are not dependent on its outcome.

## **Satellite Broadband**

Responding to the poor level of broadband connectivity in Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre, the Trust are now able to offer a 'Satellite Broadband' fund, for those households wishing to connect to broadband via a satellite provider. The fund offers assistance with the installation costs only; the monthly contract payments must be met by the user.

We are working towards a long-term solution to broadband connectivity on our islands, under our 'Next Generation Access' project. To help us with this project, we would be grateful if you could please complete our broadband speeds form, if you have not already done so - the form can be downloaded from our website, or paper copies can be collected from the office.

### **3. Scottish Sea Farms**

The members have been asked for feedback following the presentation by the Regional Manager.

#### **Action Point**

- The members have asked the Clerk to write asking for updates as this matter progresses.

### **4. Verge Maintenance**

The members are frustrated at the poor quality of service given to the islands since the Road Operative has been off work. Casual staff have now been employed however, large areas of the verge were left uncut due to wildflower growth and this has had safety implications for people on the roads.

#### **Action Point**

The members have asked the Clerk to write to the Road Operations Manger covering the following points:

- pointing out that the absence of the islands Operative has been noted and he was greatly missed and that they hope he will be returning to work soon;
- that Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre, having single track roads, should receive at least two cuts per year, not just the one, as safety is a big issue; and
- that a contingency plan should be in operation for these emergency situations.

### **5. Signage and road markings at the Pier and Kirkyard Maintenance**

The members are still awaiting a response from the Development & Infrastructure Department who attended Egilsay & Rousay to discuss the issues the islands wanted addressed and this covered signage at the Pier, renewing of road markings and Kirkyard maintenance. Following the road show, the team have been visiting the other four sets of islands however, the members now feel it is time for action.

#### **Action Point**

- The members have asked the Clerk to chase Democratic Services for a response.

### **6. Looking for applicants to join the REWGCC**

Democratic Services should soon be advertising for a replacement member for the REWGCC following the resignation from the council by Mr Hull, who now resides on mainland.

#### **Action Point**

- The members have asked the Clerk to request Democratic Services to begin the recruitment process.

### **7. Nurse cover on the islands**

The members discussed the fact that nurse cover on the islands was currently only for two days instead of the agreed three days per week.

#### **Action Point**

- The Clerk will write to NHS Orkney asking for an update of the situation.

### **8. Delays in getting prescriptions filled on the islands**

Ms Cox brought this matter to the attention of the members that several people on Egilsay had complained about the delay in getting their prescriptions filled once medications had been requested. In some instances people were going ten days before receiving their filled prescriptions and often these could be incorrect or have items missing, adding to an unacceptable level of care. Councillor Hagan expressed his concern that this was occurring, and that the matter needed resolving.

#### **Action Point**

- The members have asked the Clerk to write to NHS Orkney asking them to look at the process in place, with a view to speeding up the delivery of medications to the islands.

## 9. Poor condition of waste bins on Egilsay - Representation from Ms Cox

Ms Cox brought to this matter to the attention of the members that the large green waste bins at Egilsay Pier were in a poor condition with wheels rusting off and lids that did not catch and stay closed. She showed photographs of the condition of the bins and explained that she had reported this to the Waste Services Department and also requested additional sacks however, she felt that the CC should follow this matter up. Councillor Hagan asked about the need for these bins and Ms Cox explained the situation on Egilsay.

### Action Point

- The members have asked the Clerk to request Democratic Services to contact the Waste Services Department to get this matter dealt with urgently.

## POLICE SCOTLAND

### BEAT THE BOGUS CALLER

*If in doubt "Keep Them Out"*

The police are asking all Community Councils to remind people about 'doorstep crime'.

Bogus callers are people who:-

- Cold call at your home
- Aim to gain financial advantage through Fraud and other means, including theft.
- Claim to be from companies such as the water, gas or electricity boards, in order to gain access to a house and then steal items within

Following these 8 steps below can help prevent you from becoming a victim of doorstep crime.

- Use the door viewer if you have one when answering the door
- Check identification badges of anyone calling at your door
- If you don't know the person who is calling, and you're not expecting them, don't let them in
- If you have a password with a company make sure the caller uses it
- Never let people try to persuade you to let them into your home. If someone is persistent, ask them to call at another time and arrange for a friend or family member to be with you
- Never agree to pay for goods or give money to strangers who arrive at your door
- Don't keep large amounts of money in your home
- If the person refused to leave your door, dial 999 and ask for the Police

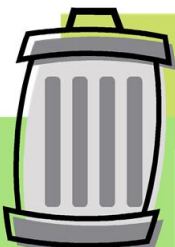
